Fasting 101

Expecting Miracles Every Day

This year, our theme as a church is about miracles. In January, we learned about some of the miracles in the book of Acts: empowerment, healing, provision, guidance, deliverance, and protection. In this devotional, we'll take a look at more miracles in Acts and how God empowers us to be channels of His miracles, so that He may be known in our families, our cities, our nation, and the rest of the world.

Connect

All of us have needs and wants. Needs are things that we cannot live without. Wants are things we would like to have. What are some of your needs? What are some of your wants? There are many things we need and want. But sometimes, we focus so much on our needs and wants that we put aside our relationship with God. Fasting lets us focus more on God by setting aside our needs and wants.

What is fasting?

Fasting is stopping an activity (usually eating) for a period of time to know and hear God more. We replace eating or using our gadgets with time with God. This means praying, worshiping, and reading the Bible. These activities strengthen our relationship with God.

When our parents speak to us, we should pay attention and listen to them. Fasting helps us pay attention and listen to God. It helps us put aside distractions. We say to God, "I am going to listen to You because You are my Father. I trust You!"

Jesus gave us an example of fasting in Matthew 4. Jesus knew that He would need strength and power for His ministry. He prepared by fasting for forty days in the desert. During this time, He was tempted by Satan.

His response to that temptation is the truth we can hold on to for strength when we fast:

Jesus answered, “It is written, ‘Man must not live only on bread. He must also live on every word that comes from the mouth of **Matthew 4:4**

Fasting is usually keeping yourself from eating and drinking as you devote more time to God. But you can also fast from different media (TV, video games) and technology (gadgets, internet) if you cannot fast from food. The important thing is to keep your focus away from the things the world offers to spend more time with God.

BEFORE FASTING

1. Pray

Spend time reading the Bible before the fast. Ask the Holy Spirit for guidance in your prayers. Write down your specific prayer requests for your family, friends, church, and nation.

2. Commit

Pray about the kind of fast that you will do and commit to it ahead of time. Ask God for grace to help you follow through with your decision. Also, ask your parents and maybe even your doctor if you are allowed to do a specific type of food fast.

3. Act

If you will be fasting from food, start eating smaller portions a few days before you fast. Avoid sugary and fatty foods. Ask someone to be your prayer partner throughout the fast.

WHILE FASTING

1. Focus

Set aside time to read God's word and pray. This devotional will help you go through your fast. Just be ready to listen to God's voice and do what the Holy Spirit is telling you.

2. Pray

If you can, join at least one prayer meeting in your church. Pray for your family, church, pastors, nation, campuses, and missions throughout the week.

3. Fill Up

During mealtimes, if you're fasting from food, read the Bible and pray instead. Drink plenty of water and rest as much as you can. Keep in mind that you may find yourself becoming physically weak, tired, impatient, or irritated. If you're doing a different type of fast, read the Bible and pray during the time you would normally do what you are fasting from (for example, browsing through social media or playing video games).

AFTER FASTING

1. Eat

If you fasted from food, reintroduce solid food gradually. Your body will need time to adjust to a normal diet. Start with fruits, juices, and salad, then add more vegetables. Eat small portions throughout the day. It may be tempting, but try not to eat junk food and sweets right away. If you've finished a different type of fast, remember what God revealed to you as you spent time with Him. Take what you learned from the fast into your everyday life.

2. Pray

Don't stop praying! Trust that God will keep His promises and knows what He's doing. Don't stop believing in and listening to God all year. Be in faith and expect God to answer your prayers!

Introduction

Miraculous Power through the Holy Spirit



CONNECT

Prepare:

Î One or two appliances that need batteries to work (e.g., flashlight, cell phone, laptop, radio)

Î Batteries (both functioning and dead batteries)

What to do:

Î Place the batteries in the appliances and turn them on. Ask the kids, “Do they work? Why?” Then, take out the batteries and put the dead batteries in their place. Let the kids check to see if they are working. Ask them, “Why are they not working?”

Î You see, while appliances can do many things, they are nothing without the batteries. The batteries supply power and with them, the appliances are able to function well.

Let’s see how this is similar to our Bible story.

READ THE WORD

At this time, Jesus had already resurrected. He was with His disciples and was giving them instructions before He went up to heaven.

1Theophilus, I wrote about Jesus in my earlier book. I wrote about all he did and taught 2until the day he was taken up to heaven. Before Jesus left, he gave orders to the apostles he had chosen. He did this through the Holy Spirit. 3After his suffering and death, he appeared to them. In many ways he proved that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of 40 days. During that time he spoke about God’s kingdom. 4One day Jesus was eating with them. He gave them a command. “Do not leave Jerusalem,” he said. “Wait for the gift my Father promised. You have heard me talk about it. 5John baptized with water. But in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.” 6Then the apostles gathered around Jesus and asked him a question. “Lord,” they said, “are you going to give the kingdom back to Israel now?” 7He said to them, “You should not be concerned about times or dates. The Father has set them by his own authority. 8But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you. Then you will tell people about me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria. And you

will even tell other people about me from one end of the earth to the other.” **Acts 1:1-8**

Jesus’ final words to His followers was a promise of the power they would receive when the Holy Spirit comes upon them. But, this power is very different from the power from batteries. The power from the Holy Spirit is the kind that can do mighty works and miracles, such as healing the sick and casting out demons. It can produce signs and wonders and it can change lives. As you continue to read the rest of the book, the disciples used this power to perform miraculous acts that showed people who God is and how much He loves them.

HUDDLE

Parents to Kids

2–6 years old

👤 What would you do if you had the power to heal sick people? Who can give us the ability to do this?

7–12 years old

👤 Do you want to receive the Holy Spirit and the power God can give you? How does a person receive the Holy Spirit?

Kids to Parents

👤 Have you experienced the power of the Holy Spirit? How did you become sure that you have the Holy Spirit within you?

The Holy Spirit that was given to the apostles is available to us today. God gave the gift of the Holy Spirit for a purpose. He is empowering us because He has a mission for us, and that is to tell others about Him.

PRAY

Dear God, thank You for the gift of the Holy Spirit and for giving us the power to be witnesses of Your love. Give us the courage to tell others about You. Give us the heart and compassion to share Your love with others. In Jesus’ name, amen!

DISCOVER

As we continue studying the book of Acts, here are some interesting facts about this book:

The book of Acts is a continuation of the Gospel of Luke. They were both written by the same author and many believe they were halves of one work as both books were addressed to Theophilus.

In Acts, Luke himself was present in the book. He was part of Paul's journey to Macedonia (Acts 16:10–12); he was present in the trip from Macedonia to Jerusalem (Acts 20–21); and he was also part of the journey to Rome (Acts 27–28). Luke himself was an active participant!

Day 1

In Jerusalem: Extraordinary Miracles through Ordinary People



CONNECT

On your way to school (or any place you will go to this week), take time to look at the road signs you will see along the way. See if you can correctly tell what they mean. Check your answers on the internet.

Signs are meant to convey a message or point us to something. Let's check what the signs in our Bible story today are pointing us to.

READ THE WORD

¹²The apostles did many signs and wonders among the people. All the believers used to meet together at Solomon's Porch. ¹³No outsider dared to join them. But the people thought highly of them. ¹⁴More and more men and women believed in the Lord. They joined the other believers. ¹⁵So people brought those who were sick into the streets. They placed them on beds and mats. They hoped that at least Peter's shadow might fall on some of them as he walked by. ¹⁶Crowds even gathered from the towns around Jerusalem. They brought their sick people. They also brought those who were suffering because of evil spirits. All of them were healed. **Acts 5:12-16**

What a picture of the early church! The apostles were ordinary men, yet they were performing signs and wonders, resulting in many people believing in God. Whenever the church would come together, amazing things happened among them. Everywhere they went, people brought those who were sick to the apostles and they were healed. This is truly the miraculous work of the Holy Spirit, and the same Holy Spirit is available to us now. When we have the Holy Spirit, we can also do mighty works, just as the disciples did, so that we, too, can be witnesses for God!

HUDDLE

Parents to Kids

2–6 years old

- Î Do you know what a witness means? (Parents can explain to their kids that a witness is someone who can provide information, or tell others, about something they have actually seen, heard or experienced.)

7–12 years old

- Î Is there anyone around you in your family, school, or neighborhood, who needs to experience a miracle? Will you be bold enough to pray for that person?

Kids to Parents

- Î Have you experienced the Holy Spirit at work in your life? Tell us about it.
- Î How will we know the Holy Spirit is in us?

Through the Holy Spirit, we too can experience God's signs and wonders in our schools, offices, and the people around us. Along with these miracles, we have a message that needs to be shared and we have the Holy Spirit's power to share it. People around us need to hear it. Will you be bold, stand up for Jesus, and do what God has commanded?

PRAY

Dear God, thank You for the gift of the Holy Spirit and for empowering us to do mighty works. We pray that You would be known through Your miracles. Open our eyes and ears and give us the words to say so they will know You. In Jesus' name, amen!

DISCOVER

The book of Acts tells of the mighty deeds the disciples did through the Holy Spirit. There are miracles scattered throughout the book. Here are some of them:

↑ Peter heals a lame man (Acts 3:1–10)

↑ Peter and John freed from prison (Acts 5:17–20)

↑ Philip performs miracles in Samaria (Acts 8)

↑ Paul's encounter with Jesus, his healing and conversion (Acts 9:1–19)

↑ Peter heals Aeneas and raises Dorcas from the dead (Acts 9:32–43)

↑ Cornelius and his household are saved (Acts 10)

↑ Peter freed from prison (Acts 12:1–19)

From the early church and up to this day, the Holy Spirit continues to perform signs and wonders through ordinary people who believe in God. Through them, people are encountering God and lives are being transformed. As His child, the work of the Holy Spirit can continue through you. Will you allow the Holy Spirit to work through you?

Day 2

In Judea and Samaria: Door-Opening Miracles through Persecuted People



CONNECT

Pass the Message

Let the whole family form a straight line. The goal is to pass the message from the first person to the last person. Your message may be a quote, a Bible verse, or something that you can repeat out loud after hearing it a few times. See if you can successfully pass the message all the way to the last person.

In our story today, the believers were also passing a message. Let's see what happened after they did it.

READ THE WORD

¹ . . . On that day the church in Jerusalem began to be attacked and treated badly. All except the apostles were scattered throughout Judea and Samaria. ² Godly Jews buried Stephen. They mourned deeply for him. ³ But Saul began to destroy the church. He went from house to house. He dragged away men and women and put them in prison. ⁴ The believers who had been scattered preached the word everywhere they went. ⁵ Philip went down to a city in Samaria. There he preached about the Messiah. ⁶ The crowds listened to Philip and saw the signs he did. All of them paid close attention to what he said.

⁷ Evil spirits screamed and came out of many people. Many people who were disabled or who couldn't walk were healed. ⁸ So there was great joy in that city. ⁹ A man named Simon lived in the city. For quite a while he had practiced evil magic there. He amazed all the people of Samaria. He claimed to be someone great. ¹⁰ And all the people listened to him, from the least important of them to the most important. They exclaimed, "It is right to call this man the Great Power of God!" ¹¹ He had amazed them for a long time with his evil magic. So they followed him. ¹² But Philip announced the good news of God's kingdom and the name of Jesus Christ. So men and women believed and were baptized. ¹³ Simon himself believed and was baptized. He followed Philip everywhere. He was amazed by the great signs and miracles he saw. **Acts 8:1-13**

Imagine this: the church was being persecuted and many of the believers were scattered to many different places. In spite of this, many disciples boldly preached the good news about Jesus wherever they went and many people believed. Philip was one of those who preached the gospel to Samaria, an unlikely place that no Jew would go to because of their differences in their cultures. In fact, the Jews looked down on the Samaritans because they were mixed with other races and were not of pure Jewish blood. God wanted them to experience the saving power of Jesus. When Philip preached and performed signs and wonders, people paid attention. Even the most unlikely people, like Simon the sorcerer, believed and he was baptized.

This is the power of God. When God's people move, the results can be exponential. It can surpass persecution, it can reach unlikely people, and it can transform lives.

HUDDLE

Parents to Kids

2–6 years old

Î Do you know how to tell your friends about Jesus? What will you say to them?

7–12 years old

Î What are the things you usually talk to your friends about? Do you talk about Jesus?

Î What are some things about Jesus you would tell others?

Kids to Parents

Î How do you tell others about Jesus? What if they do not believe or what if they reject what you tell them?

Today, we can also find ourselves in unlikely places or situations. But God is not limited by this and wants to be known by others. Now is the time to boldly speak up and tell others about Jesus. Let's do our part and believe that God will do a mighty work in their lives!

PRAY

Dear God, thank You for giving us Your Son, Jesus Christ, to die for our sins. We pray that You will help us tell others about Him because they need to hear Your message. We pray that they will believe and just like in the story, they will also be baptized. In Jesus' name, amen!

DISCOVER

There are actually two Philips in the Bible!

The more popular Philip is one of the disciples of Jesus. We see him in the Gospel of John:

↑ Jesus calls Philip to follow Him (John 1:43–44)

↑ Jesus feeds the 5,000 (John 6:1–15)

↑ Jesus tells of His death and resurrection (John 12:20–22)

↑ Jesus and the Father (John 14:8–14)

The Philip we have seen in today's passage is a different Philip. He is usually referred to as Philip the Evangelist or Philip the Deacon, to distinguish him from the apostle. He was one of the seven appointed by the disciples to serve the people. And his stories are mainly found in the book of Acts:

↑ Philip is chosen as one of the seven leaders (Acts 6:5)

↑ Philip in Samaria (Acts 8)

↑ Philip offers his house to Paul (Acts 21:8)

Day 3

To the End of the Earth: Eye-Opening Miracles through Reluctant People



CONNECT

God works through the preaching of the gospel and the miracles that come with doing so. One way of seeing God work is through prayer. Today, for our activity, we will make a prayer list.

Prepare:

- 1 Bond paper or light-colored construction paper
- 1 Dark-colored construction paper
- 1 Ruler
- 1 Scissors
- 1 Pencil or pen
- 1 Coloring materials
- 1 Glue or tape
- 1 Other materials for decoration (optional)

What to do:

1. Select two pieces of paper: one light-colored and another one that's dark-colored for the border.
2. Take the paper you chose for the border.
3. Using a ruler and a pencil, from the edge of the paper, mark out one and half inches on all sides, creating an even rectangle in the center of the paper.
4. Gently fold the construction paper evenly in the center. Try not to press too hard on the sides so it won't leave a mark on the border. Use the scissors to cut out the center rectangle marks leaving a perfect rectangle frame.
5. Decorate the frame with crayons, pentel pen, paper, or other materials. Be creative!
Take the frame and paste it evenly on the light-colored paper.
6. On the light-colored paper write the words "Prayer List" on top.
7. Write down the names of people you want to pray for. Post your prayer
8. list in a place where you can see it every day and pray for them.

Did you know that God can bring healing, change, and miracles through our prayers? God asked Ananias to lay hands on someone for healing. But, what if that someone is not a friend or has not treated you well in the past?

READ THE WORD

Have you ever met someone that seemed strange or different? Have you ever encountered a bully?

What if one day, God asks you to reach out to someone like that? Could you obey God in that situation?

In the Bible, God asked a disciple named Ananias to do something similar in

Acts 9:10–19:

¹⁰In Damascus there was a believer named Ananias. The Lord called out to him in a vision. “Ananias!” he said. “Yes, Lord,” he answered. ¹¹The Lord told him, “Go to the house of Judas on Straight Street. Ask for a man from Tarsus named Saul. He is praying. ¹²In a vision Saul has seen a man come and place his hands on him. That man’s name is Ananias. In the vision, Ananias placed his hands on Saul so he could see again.” ¹³“Lord,” Ananias answered, “I’ve heard many reports about this man. They say he has done great harm to your holy people in Jerusalem. ¹⁴Now he has come here to arrest all those who worship you. The chief priests have given him authority to do this.” ¹⁵But the Lord said to Ananias, “Go! I have chosen this man to work for me. He will announce my name to the Gentiles and to their kings. He will also announce my name to the people of Israel. ¹⁶I will show him how much he must suffer for me.” ¹⁷Then Ananias went to the house and entered it. He placed his hands on Saul. “Brother Saul,” he said, “you saw the Lord Jesus. He appeared to you on the road as you were coming here. He has sent me so that you will be able to see again. You will be filled with the Holy Spirit.” ¹⁸Right away something like scales fell from Saul’s eyes. And he could see again. He got up and was baptized. ¹⁹After eating some food, he got his strength back.

God gave Ananias specific instructions to go and meet Saul. God had already given Saul a vision that Ananias would go and heal him. But Saul was no ordinary man. He was a known persecutor of Christians. He

approved the execution of Stephen (Acts 8:1–2) and had the authority to capture and imprison all the Christians he had found (Acts 9:1–2).

It must have sounded crazy to Ananias when he heard this. How could God ask him to risk his life to meet Saul? How could he pray for someone who was hurting the church? But God had a plan and Ananias obeyed. God used Ananias to heal Saul and become His instrument to change Saul's life. After this encounter, Saul went to the synagogues, preaching about Jesus and proclaiming the good news (Acts 9:20–22). Everyone was surprised since they knew that Saul had come to Damascus to hurt and arrest Christians.

Saul today is known throughout the world as the apostle Paul. He wrote about a fourth of the New Testament and was a known leader in the early church. God used him to reach the Gentiles and did many miracles through him. The gospel can reach anyone, even those who are opposed to it. God used an ordinary person like Ananias to do something extraordinary. What do you think would have happened to Saul if Ananias had not obeyed? He would have been stuck in the house blind! He would not have been able to preach the gospel and tell others of God's love for him. We would not have the New Testament as we know it today. The obedience of Ananias did not only change Saul's life but changed the lives of many people, even beyond his lifetime.

As God used Ananias to heal Saul, God can use us to make a difference in the lives of others, especially those we are not comfortable with.

HUDDLE

In our Bible story for today, we learned that God used Ananias to heal Saul.

Parents to Kids

Do you believe the gospel can touch even the hardest of hearts? The story of Saul (who became Paul) is proof that it can! God can use you to touch people's lives. Just as Ananias obeyed God's difficult instruction, let us be obedient when there is something God wants us to do. Even if we may be afraid or doubtful of the outcome, we can trust God and His purposes.

PRAY

Dear God, thank You for Ananias's obedience. His obedience to You became a blessing to many. I pray that You would use me to bless others, just like Ananias was to Saul. I ask that You would give me the grace and courage to obey You, even if things are hard or don't make sense. Use me to make a difference in the lives of others. Thank You, God. In Jesus' name, amen.

DISCOVER

Who was Ananias?

If not for his obedience to God to go see Saul, Ananias would have been just another one of the many believers at that time. But God called him and he obeyed, without knowing what the results of his obedience would be. He may have been afraid and reluctant at first, but when there was no doubt in his mind what God wanted him to do, he obeyed.

His obedience showed us the kind of love we, as followers of Christ, should have: loyalty to God, humility, and gentleness. We are to show this even to those who we may perceive as an enemy. Ananias did not take credit for neither his actions nor the miracle that he performed. Instead, he pointed Saul to Jesus, his Lord. What a blessing this man was!

Conclusion

Miracles through Us Today



CONNECT

Ask your kids: “Do you remember receiving instructions from us when we left you for a while on your own? What did we say?” (Share why you gave those instructions.)

Like us, Jesus also gave His disciples some instructions before He had to go back to heaven. Let’s find out what He told them.

READ THE WORD

¹⁵He said to them, “Go into all the world. Preach the good news to everyone. ¹⁶Anyone who believes and is baptized will be saved. But anyone who does not believe will be punished. ¹⁷Here are the miraculous signs that those who believe will do. In my name they will drive out demons. They will speak in languages they had not known before. ¹⁸They will pick up snakes with their hands. And when they drink deadly poison, it will not hurt them at all. They will place their hands on sick people. And the people will get well.” ¹⁹When the Lord Jesus finished speaking to them, he was taken up into heaven. He sat down at the right hand of God. ²⁰Then the disciples went out and preached everywhere. The Lord worked with them. And he backed up his word by the signs that went with it. **Mark 16:15–20**

Jesus told His disciples to go and proclaim the gospel not just to the Jews, but to all kinds of people. This is a very important task because God wants everyone to know Him and for His kingdom to advance. God’s kingdom is not about a specific place. In fact, His kingdom is among all those who recognize Jesus as King, put their trust in Him, and obey Him. This means that His righteousness, peace, and joy is seen in everything we do. When you look at your school, office, or community, there are many people who still need to hear the gospel. Today, God is partnering with us, His people—you and me—to do this work. Just as Jesus did not leave the disciples empty handed, His promise still stands today. The Holy Spirit is still at work, and signs and wonders will accompany wherever His word is preached. May this make us bold as we continue with this task.

HUDDLE

As a family, think of how you can be witnesses of God's miracles so that He would be known by the people around us. Act in confidence that the Holy Spirit will work as He did with the early church. Pray and ask God for His leading in your home, in school, in the workplace, in your neighborhood or community, and in your nation.

- Î What do you think following Jesus as King is like?
- Î Why are instructions important? What do they do for us?

7–12 years old

- Î What are the people in God's kingdom like? Does your life reflect His kingdom?

We are God's partners in this mission. When Jesus gave the command to go and make disciples before He went back to heaven, it was for the Church—us—to carry on. Will you do your part in carrying out God's plan?

PRAY

Dear God, thank You for the gift of the Holy Spirit, and for empowering us to do as You have commanded us.
